Visit new and exciting places with us!

August 26—Kennywood Park

Join us for a trip to Kennywood, Pittsburgh's amusement park since 1898. Try some of the newest and fastest roller coasters as well as some original, old-fashioned rides. There is a special section for young children. 9:00am to 7:00 pm.

September 23—Blennerhassett Island Historic State Park

Blennerhassett Island is located at the western edge of West Virginia in the Ohio River. We'll visit the museum in Parkersburg then take the boat to the island where we'll explore the house and grounds and share a picnic. 8:00am to 9:00pm

October 21—Cass Scenic Railroad

January—Ice-Skating at the Morgantown Ice Arena
